







## Migration Atlases

The first migration atlas in Europe has been published by Schüz & Weigold in 1931. The 5 volumes of the ZINK atlas followed in the 1975 to 1995. Recently a number of EURING member schemes have published new atlases with ring recovery data or started to work on such atlas projects. The new atlases make much use of modern methods like GIS technology, powerful database operations and new statistical approaches. They provide basic information for an immense number of other studies from bird distribution through bird migration to conservation and even disease management, as illustrated by recent research on avian flu.



First migration map of White Storks Ciconia ciconia, ca. 1930, Vogelwarte Rossitten





