

# Our history

Since 1970 all ringing activities in Belarus were carried out and coordinated by Belarus section of USSR Bird Ringing Centre at the Institute of Zoology, Belarus Academy of Sciences (Minsk).

After creation of independent state (the Republic of Belarus) bird ringing was practically stopped. Some professional ornithologists carried on bird ringing with Moscow and Estonian rings. In 1996 first 50 000 new national rings with Belarus inscriptions were produced due to financial support of the Secretariat of CMS (Bonn Convention).

Ringing office was organised in March 1998 within the scope of Danish Environmental Support Fund (DenSF) with the assistance of Ornis Consult Ltd. (Denmark).

## **BELARUS RINGS**

- 1996-2002 aluminium rings produced by "ARANEA", Poland;
- 2003 steel rings for waterbirds produced by "MEKANISKA" Sweden;
- Since 2007 all rings produced by "PORZANA" England.

Supported by Secretariat of Bonn Convention, DenSF (Denmark), SEEN (Poland), NABU (Germany) and RSPB (Great Britain)

## **BELARUS RINGS**

Now 32 types of rings are in use.

Smallest size is 2.0 mm and largest 30.0 mm diameter.








### **NUMBERS OF BIRDS RINGED IN 1996-2008**




#### **NUMBERS OF BIRDS RECOVERED IN 1996-2008**
